


My Open Library

Unlimited Access 8am - 10pm

What is My Open Library?

It is a service that allows for additional opening hours over and above normal staffed opening hours.





Users register for the service and are given a dedicated swipe card and informed of the terms and conditions of this service.

They can then access the library between 8-10am before regular opening hours every morning and from regular closing hours until 10pm daily.

What services will be available?

Users can:-

- Borrow and return books and other items
- Use the public computers and WiFi
- Print and photocopy material
- Study
- Have meetings



My Open Library allows users and communities' better choice in when they can visit their local library. It is not designed to replace the need for trained and knowledgeable library staff but to allow those interested to use services that can be carried out independently.






